As we reflect back on 2020, we can safely say that this was a year like none we have seen before. At the YMCA of Greater Hartford, a robust strategic growth plan for 2020 was put on hold when the pandemic struck, and we were forced to reset, closing our facilities and cancelling our popular sleepover camps. As of this writing, while the precise timing and definition of "returning to normal" aren't clear yet, there are many reasons for optimism.

The Y is still standing strong, supporting the health and wellbeing of our kids, our families, and our neighborhoods, just as we have for 169 years. Faced with evolving needs in our communities, we renewed the ways in which we serve them. We helped parents struggling with at-home education. We delivered Zoom exercise classes to those who otherwise had no access to programming. We provided emergency childcare to essential workers. As soon as we safely could, we reopened to our members, who were eager to get back to the gym and reconnect with friends—especially our senior groups.

We doubled down on our day-camp facilities and summer programs so that the kids in the 52 towns we serve could socialize, learn, and stay active outdoors. Mission-based offerings, like food distribution sites in Hartford, East Hartford, and Putnam, were created and deployed. We partnered with Trinity Health Of New England to educate our staff and members across our 12 facilities, with training on infection prevention protocols and sanitization that went above and beyond CDC recommendations, achieving a remarkable record of success in keeping COVID-19 at bay. And, we played a central role among Connecticut camps and cross-industry business leaders in policy discussions with government and health officials.

A major component of our mission is delivering all desired services to everyone, regardless of their ability to pay. We've steadfastly adhered to this principle during the crisis, making it a larger part of our day-to-day delivery, and we are proud of the safety net we have provided.

This past year has also required Y leadership to make painful and difficult choices.

Responsible financial stewardship prescribed

that we adjust our delivery model, which
we were able to do while maintaining all major
facilities and programs, from child development
and youth sports to aquatics and general
gym memberships; preserving our ability
to withstand future challenges for decades
to come; and committing to renew
our interaction with the community,
combining traditional, successful services
with enhanced virtual programming and
innovative, digital health maintenance.

Just like yesterday, with the support of our members, volunteers, and stakeholders, the Y can be counted on when needed, today and tomorrow.

Al reflexionar sobre 2020, podemos decir con seguridad que este fue un año como ninguno que hayamos visto antes. En la YMCA de Greater Hartford, un sólido plan de crecimiento estratégico para 2020 se suspendió cuando se produjo la pandemia y nos vimos obligados a reiniciar, cerrar nuestras instalaciones y cancelar nuestros populares campamentos de pijamas. Al momento de escribir esto, aunque el momento preciso y la definición de "volver a la normalidad" aún no están claros, existen muchas razones para el optimismo.

La "Y" todavía se mantiene firme, apoyando la salud y el bienestar de nuestros hijos, nuestras familias y nuestros vecindarios, tal y como lo hemos hecho durante 169 años. Ante la evolución de las necesidades de nuestras comunidades, renovamos la forma en que les prestamos

servicio. Ayudamos a los padres que luchan con la educación en el hogar. Dimos clases de ejercicios de Zoom a aquellos que de otra manera no tenían acceso a la programación. Brindamos guarderías de emergencia a trabajadores esenciales. Tan pronto como lo pudimos hacer con seguridad, reabrimos a nuestros miembros, que estaban ansiosos por volver al gimnasio y volver a conectar con amigos, especialmente con nuestros grupos de personas mayores.

Retomamos nuestras instalaciones de campamento diurno y programas de verano para que los niños de las 52 ciudades que atendemos pudieran socializar, aprender y mantenerse activos al aire libre. Se crearon e implementaron ofertas basadas en misiones, como sitios de distribución de alimentos en Hartford,

East Hartford y Putnam. Nos asociamos con Trinity
Health of New England para educar a nuestro
personal y miembros en nuestras 12 instalaciones,
con capacitación sobre protocolos de prevención
de infecciones y desinfección que superaron las
recomendaciones de los CDC, logrando un notable
historial de éxito en mantener a raya al COVID-19.
Además, desempeñamos un papel central entre los
campamentos de Connecticut y los líderes empresariales
de todas las industrias en las discusiones sobre
políticas con funcionarios gubernamentales y de salud.

Un componente importante de nuestra misión es brindar todos los servicios deseados a todos, independientemente de su capacidad de pago. Nos hemos adherido firmemente a este principio durante la crisis, convirtiéndolo en una parte más importante de nuestra entrega diaria, y estamos orgullosos de la red de seguridad que hemos proporcionado.

El año pasado también requirió que el liderazgo de la "Y" tomara decisiones dolorosas y difíciles. La administración financiera responsable prescribió que ajustáramos nuestro modelo de entrega, lo cual pudimos hacer mientras manteníamos todas las instalaciones y programas principales, desde el desarrollo infantil y los deportes juveniles hasta las actividades acuáticas y las membresías generales de gimnasios; preservamos nuestra capacidad para resistir los desafíos futuros durante las próximas décadas; y nos comprometimos a renovar nuestra interacción con la comunidad, combinando servicios tradicionales y exitosos con una programación virtual mejorada y un mantenimiento de la salud digital e innovador.

Hoy como ayer, con el apoyo de nuestros miembros, voluntarios y partes interesadas, se puede contar con la "Y" cuando se necesite, hoy y mañana.

Our kids need to be kids again, and summer camps—both day and overnight—are some of the safest and best places for this to happen. Time outdoors, activities that create healthy minds and healthy bodies, the camaraderie of new friends and old—these are the gifts that summer camps provide.

As challenging as the enforced isolation we've experienced this past year has been, perhaps our kids and teens have suffered the most. While the pandemic has been disruptive and highly taxing for all of us, children have been hit particularly hard. The upheaval they faced in nearly every aspect of their lives—remote learning, loss of social contact, canceled after-school activities, sports leagues and summer programs—was very real, both socially and emotionally, and multiple mental health studies and statistics support that view.

Going to the Y's sleepaway camps has been a positive, even life-changing, experience for many young people. Though the pandemic meant we had to cancel last summer's sleepaway camps, we were determined to offer a day camp experience that would provide our community's kids a break from their isolating grind—to get them together to play, learn, and explore the outdoors. And we did!

"Our hearts were breaking for our little boy as we watched him struggle with the emotional toll of the isolation in lockdown. We were thrilled to enroll him in the Y's summer camp program where he excelled and transformed from a frustrated, anxious, and lonely boy into the happy, curious, funny, talkative little guy we know. Camp had a profound, positive impact on his social and emotional wellbeing. We loved hearing about his adventures every day and how much he looked up to his counselors. We'll never forget the pride and happiness we saw on our son's face on the final day of camp where he, surrounded by the wonderful friends he made, shared the great news that he was recognized as camper of the summer!"

We humans are naturally social beings; our mental and physical health require us to connect with others, and isolation takes a heavy toll on our wellbeing. This is especially true for seniors, who may live alone and far from family. We talked to some of the members of an Aquacise class at the Hale YMCA Youth & Family Center to learn what their Y means to them.

Chris tells us, "Before I joined the Y, I was about 65 pounds heavier than I am now. I could see later middle age coming, and I didn't want to let things slide further. For me, the Y helped me make a great turnaround, and I honestly feel better now than I did when I was in my twenties." Chris has been a class member for three years and visited the Y six times a week up until COVID hit. "Everything in my life closed down; I worked from home; my church closed—everything. The day the Y reopened, I think I was the second person to check in!"

Carolyn nods in agreement, adding, "One of the primary reasons that I started here is because I noticed that as I was getting older, my balance was not what it should have been. Now, I can stand on one leg and put my sock on! It's great. Also, I have arthritis, and it helps immensely to be in the water where I can exercise without pain."

Their instructor Cindy tells us, "When COVID hit, I sat down and started calling all my seniors to see how everybody was doing. We're a very tightknit group, and I missed them all. Now that the Y has reopened, members are eager to get back to their exercise routines and catch up with their friends."









Diversity, inclusion, and equity are part of the YMCA's ecosystem, and nothing is more critical to reaching those goals than making sure our kids—all of our kids—get a good education. That's why the Y partners with Building Educated Leaders for Life (BELL) to implement the national Power Scholars Academy (PSA) to mitigate summer learning loss in Hartford's, East Hartford's, and West Hartford's economically disadvantaged communities.

Students from underserved communities not enrolled in a summer learning program lose an average of two months of learning each summer. And, statistics show that if the learning loss is not addressed by the third or fourth grade, the slide is much tougher to stop. The PSA is designed to combat this loss: Between 2018 and 2020, students in our PSA, on average, gained 1.2 months in math skills and 1.4 months in reading skills.


Each year, the PSA serves students in grades K through 5. Daily, students are instructed in math and literacy for 3 hours, then participate in 1.5 hours of enrichment courses, such as art, drama, music, STEM, life skills, physical education, and more. Each week, students go on field trips or have an on-site field day with community volunteers.

The instructors' engagement and enthusiasm play a big part in the success of the program, and many come back year after year to participate. Jessica Duque, a grade 5 academic teacher, told us, "COVID-19 really impacted the way the students have been able to access their teachers. It felt very good to build relationships with each student as it was apparent that they truly missed seeing their teachers and friends."

"You'll come here; you'll make lifelong friends."

"Volunteer, philanthropist, visionary, dedicated, passionate, team-focused, compassionate, and positive": These are the words those who nominated her used to describe this year's Robert C. Knox, Jr. YMCA **Distinguished Leadership Award** recipient, Betty Hale, a tireless advocate for the residents of **Northeast Connecticut. The** driving force in getting the Hale YMCA Youth and Family Center built, Betty envisioned a community center where families could participate in healthy activities in a supportive environment.

For Betty Hale, philanthropy
has always been about helping
children. When she married
her late husband, Newell, and
moved to the Putnam area, she
remembers, "There really was no
place for the local kids to swim.
After my husband passed away,
my son Laurence said, 'Mom,
you've been talking about a pool
in this area for years; why don't
you do something about it?""

Betty started looking for the ideal place to put in a community pool that could serve the several small towns in the area, ultimately partnering with the YMCA of Greater Hartford to build what became a full-service Y. As Campaign Trustee of the Hale Y Capital Campaign, Betty was a tireless fundraiser and persuasive champion for the project, and she reflects, "The whole process took ten years from the time we started talking about it to the day we opened the doors." On her first tour of the new Hale YMCA, Betty was delighted and touched to see her name was on one of the pool doors, and her husband's name was on the other: "The day before the Y officially opened, my whole family came to see the new pool, and we all jumped in for the first swim. It was a great thrill." The expansive new Hale facility is a far cry from her childhood neighborhood's much more modest YMCA back in Brooklyn, NY: "Our Y was just a storefront, not a gym, but it was a place we could go to participate in activities. When I was in high school, I joined the student government group, and I remember going to the state Capitol in Albany with another friend to represent our Y."

Altruism is a family value for Betty, who remembers her parents as active volunteers in their community. Her personal

involvement in philanthropy began in the 1970s when she started working with conductor Sarah Caldwell and the Opera Company of Boston to bring professional opera to adults and school children in Northeast Connecticut. Betty was instrumental in launching a local branch of Opera New England, which brought free performances of children's operas to schools in 23 towns in Northeast Connecticut. The program was so successful that they soon created another for 3rd graders to hear the New Haven Symphony, and a few years later, they created a free in-school music program offered to kindergarteners called "Science of Sound." Another group she spearheaded and supports is the Community Cultural Committee, which brings New York theater programs to the area for school children.

Helping raise awareness and funds for good causes was a passion Betty shared with her late husband, and they were active in many charitable endeavors in Northeast Connecticut, from helping neighbors through the Lions Club, Access Community Action Agency, Daily Bread, and the Thompson **Ecumenical Empowerment** Group, to helping raise funds for a birthing center, new surgical suites, and emergency room renovations at Day Kimball Hospital. "In a small town, you

need a lot of volunteers to get things done" she says—and Betty certainly gets things done. At 91, she shows no signs of slowing down and is still actively raising money to support the Y and her community's families.

When asked what she'd like to be remembered for, Betty pauses thoughtfully, then says, "To have promoted the arts, culture, and healthy living opportunities for children, families, and seniors."

Getting the Robert C. Knox, Jr. YMCA Distinguished Leadership Award is an honor for which Betty's deeply appreciative, and she's still actively involved in looking for new ways that the Y can help the community. One successful program that Betty champions offers free swim classes to all 2nd grade children in Putnam. Summer day camps and classes have also been a hit with families. And, she'd like to see the Hale YMCA facility expand to make it even more accessible: "There are always more needs that come up and that the Y can help meet. I'm interested in the academic programs the Y offers to help students succeed, which I hope we can offer in Putnam. Hale had a very popular day camp over the summer, and kids did their remote learning this past year right here at the Y. It was a great help to working parents."


